



WASTE MANAGEMENT POLICY

BEKK Solutions (BEKK) accepts that by the very nature of the Company's operations, substantial quantities of waste are produced, whether they originate from the office, onshore or offshore project sites. In accordance with the Bekk Environmental Policy, all such waste must be correctly disposed of to avoid environmental pollution and to enhance an environment sustaining recycling program.

Waste is defined as those substances or objects that no longer have a commercial value and as such cannot be economically re-used or repaired. The generation of waste represents an inefficient use of resources and energy. Implementation of these procedures by all employees is fundamental to achieving improved environmental and business standards

The basis of our waste management strategy shall be:

Reduction - generate less waste through more efficient practices;

Reuse - re-use waste materials in their original form;

Recycle - convert waste back into a reusable material;

Recover - extract material or energy from waste for other uses

The principles of reduction, reuse; recycle, and recover shall, as far as is practicable, be applied to all waste streams and thereby reduce overall company running costs.

Reducing waste generation improves financial performance through lower materials consumption and reduced disposal cost.

The approach to waste reduction is based upon the following general principles:

- ▶ minimize stocks and reduce the possibility of deterioration or obsolescence;
- ▶ procure non-hazardous products where possible;
- ▶ recycle materials and encourage a local recycling industry;
- ▶ provide adequate storage facilities, particularly on temporary locations, to minimize stock deterioration.
- ▶ scrap metal and similar wastes and surplus materials to be sold to a dealer.

It is the responsibility of all Directors, Managers and Supervisors to ensure that the principles of this policy are complied with in all business decisions and that all team members are made aware of the requirements and procedures that support this policy
